- 800-104 Allis Township Resolution 11-16-91
BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Michigan Karst Conservancy urges that the ongoing study of the local karst geology, and the potential effects of a sanitary landfill at the proposed Allis Township site, be fully considered before a final decision to open such a sanitary landfill is made by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

The Secretary of the MKC is requested to write a letter to the United States Forest Service in support of the most primitive management option, the Purple alternative, of the Grand Island Draft Environmental Impact Statement.
- 800-120 Biscuit Creek, Hiawatha National Forest Resolution 9-18-93
"Whereas, the Biscuit Creek Sink property contains significant karst features of Chippewa County, and
"Whereas, the property is abutted on three sides by Hiawatha National Forest, and
"Whereas the resurgence of Biscuit Creek sink is in Hiawatha National Forest,
"Be it Hereby Resolved, the Michigan Karst Conservancy recommends the acquisition of the property by Hiawatha National Forest and
"Be it further Resolved, that Michigan Karst Conservancy offers to enter into an agreement with Hiawatha National Forest, to provide monitoring and education programs for the Area."

800-145 Resolution to Cosponsor Karst and Groundwater Speakers and Lecture Series Program 4-19-97

WHEREAS it is of mutual interest to the Jesse Besser Museum of Alpena, Michigan, and the Michigan Karst Conservancy, to further karst and groundwater education through a speakers and lecture series program, and WHEREAS the Museum and the Conservancy have cooperated often in the past in related activities,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Jesse Besser Museum and the Michigan Karst Conservancy will cosponsor during 1997 a Karst and Groundwater Speakers and Lecture Series Program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Jesse Besser Museum and the Michigan Karst Conservancy will recommend speakers, provide leaders for associated tours of the Stevens Twin Sinks Preserve and provide promotional text for publicity and press releases about the Program, subject to the availability of volunteers, and that the Jesse Besser Museum will coordinate the lectures at the Museum, and speakers for outside groups, provide facilities for the Lectures, and publicize the Program, subject to the availability of staff and funds.

IN AGREEMENT THERETO the Executive Committee of the Jesse Besser Museum adopted this Resolution on 16 April 1997 and the Board of Trustees of the Michigan Karst Conservancy adopted this Resolution on the 19th of April 1997.
